Toomas Volkmann is an Estonian photographer who, over a creative journey lasting more ore than three decades, has cultivated both portrait and fashion photography as well as nature photography.

Biography

Volkmann was born on January 6, 1961, in Kivi-Vigala. After graduating from Pärnu 4th Secondary School, Volkmann, the child of veterinarian parents, enrolled in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Tartu. He studied there for three years, at the same time working part-time in emergency medicine. In Tartu, Volkmann also attended Evald Hermaküla's theater studio and, as a hobby, drew in Andrus Kasemaa's art studio.

He never mecame a doctor, instead, he eventually earned his higher education in 1986 at the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre, under course director Lembit Peterson who significantly influenced Volkmann's further artistic journey. Having become a young actor, he did not join any theatre, since the Estonian theater scene in the late 1980s did not resonate with Volkmann. So, after graduation, he started working as a singer for an Estonian early music ensemble Hortus Musicus, touring with the ensemble in various countries for several years. Early music has also deeply influenced Volkmann's work: patterns, orderliness, precision, and discipline typical of polyphonic choral singing strongly influenced his visual language.

Later, Volkmann studied photography in The London Institute, introduced an innovative fashion photography discourse in Estonia, and became the sole official chronicler for the Vibe party series, which significantly influenced the Estonian club scene since 1998. In the 2010s, he also served as a judge for the TV show "Estonian Top Model".

Works

Volkmann's interest in photography began in his early youth. From the 6th grade, he attended a school photography club. In the early 1990s, he was part of a salon-style gathering in Tallinn, alongside, among others, Peeter Laurits, Herkki-Erich Merila (later founders of DeSstudio), and Tonu Onnepalu. Between 1993-1994, Volkmann studied photography in London, after which he returned to Estonia. Since 1995, he has been working as a freelance photographer and also as an interior designer.

Volkmann began his creative career under the pseudonym Tristan Mann, taking self-portraits that introduced auto-performativity and gay sensibility to Estonian art for the first time. He exhibited his early photographs in Estonia and abroad with the group "Igavesti Sinu" ("Forever Yours"), which was formed together with other Estonian photographers.

As a fashion photographer, Volkmann has collaborated with almost all Estonian media outlets, being the author of all cover photos for the magazine "Anne" for 13 years,

among other things. His portrait photography from the 90s and the first decade of this century is also very well known.

Since 1979, Volkmann has participated in exhibitions in Estonia and abroad. The most monumental was his participation in the exhibition consisting of a hundred portraits "Eesti läbi 100 silmapaari" ("Estonia through 100 Pairs of Eyes"), created together with Tõnu Tunnel and Tõnu Runnel and later a book based on the exhibition with Kaire Van Der Toorn-Guthan. The exhibition traveled to 6 countries and 12 cities. In the fall of 2023, Volkmann's largest personal exhibition to date, "täis minevik" ("pastful blast"), was opened at Fotografiska Tallinn.
